Lindrum wines were also given as a gift to guests at the NFIS Australian seafood dinner hosted by Federal Agriculture Minister Warren Truss at Dubai's Shangri-La Hotel. Doyle again prepared the dinner, attended by general managers and executive chefs from five-star luxury hotels.
